INTRODUCTION TO INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION

27 January 2011, 9am-5.00pm

What is the aim of the module?

To provide an understanding of the general principles of international arbitration and a comparison of the main alternative dispute resolution processes – arbitration, mediation and adjudication. The course will give candidates a basic understanding of the principles of good practice and procedure in international arbitration.

What is covered within the syllabus?

- Comparison of Dispute Resolution Procedures
- Essential features, laws and rules: The UNCITRAL Model Law
- Composition, Powers and Jurisdiction of the arbitral tribunal
- Statement of Claim and Defence
- Organising the Proceedings
- Costs and Interest
- Hearings
- Arbitral Awards, drafting and enforcement
- Exercise in drafting and arbitration clause

How is the course delivered?

The course is delivered over 1 day. The day starts at 9.00am to 5.00pm.

How will I be assessed?

Assessment consists of one assignment that is distributed to candidates on the day of the course. Candidates will be given 28 days to complete and submit the assignment. The pass mark is a clear pass or fail based on understanding and knowledge. Results are dispatched to candidates normally eight to twelve weeks from the date of the conclusion of the assignment.

What are the entry requirements?

There are no entry requirements. The course is intended for candidates who:

- are new to the field of international arbitration and have not had any legal training;
- wish to learn more about international arbitration and its benefits to users;
- wish to become an Associate member of CIArb and thereafter consider taking the further courses that are part of the pathways to becoming a Member and then a Fellow.

What is the course fee and what does it include?

The standard course fee is S\$900 nett, with a preferential rate of S\$500 nett for full-time students and S\$720 nett extended to members of the following organisations:

The fee includes registration on the course, the first attempt at the assignment, study materials, lunch and refreshments throughout the day.

What happens when I register for the course?

Upon successful registration, candidates will receive confirmation they are booked on the course. Joining instructions and course materials will be sent to candidates approximately 2 weeks before the course start date.

The designated workbook for the course is 'Introduction to International Arbitration', a copy of which will be provided as part of the course materials.

What is the CI Arb's policy on 'cancellation of courses'?

CI Arb reserves the right to cancel or change the date, venue or content of programmes and the names of speakers, lecturers and tutors. Candidates will be provided with adequate notice of any change. If the Institute has to cancel a course, candidates will be provided with a full refund or the opportunity to transfer their registration to the next course. What is my next step when I complete the course?

On successful completion of this course, candidates:

- will be awarded an Introductory Certificate
- may progress onto Module 1 of any of the CI Arb Pathways – mediation, domestic arbitration, international arbitration or adjudication.
- will be eligible to apply for Associate grade of CI Arb, and take advantage of a range of educational and professional benefits.
